GAMING PLAN OF MANAGEMENT


FACT SHEET

From **1 July 2024**, all clubs with any number of gaming machines will be required to have a **Gaming Plan of Management (GPOM) in place, that is updated annually**. A GPOM identifies a venue's responsible conduct of gambling (RCG) obligations and what the venue is actively doing to meet these obligations. It provides guidance on how the venue will ensure compliance with gaming legislation and supports best practice in your approach to responsible conduct of gambling.

Liquor and Gaming NSW require a GPOM to accompany applications such as a new club licence, extended trading or variations of existing authorisations, gaming machine threshold increases, transfer of gaming machine entitlements or where the application may result in an increase in gaming activity.

The GPOM is an opportunity to identify and implement strategies that reduce gambling harm and demonstrate your corporate social responsibility and commitment to the wellbeing of your patrons and community. Your GPOM must be easily accessible in the event of inspectors visiting your venue, as well as being actively provided to your staff so they are informed of your venue's best practice approach.

- Premises plan (location of machines and cash dispensing facilities)



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
